

Marus Bridge Primary School – Sports Premium

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2016/17 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive a sum of money, however the money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits

At Marus Bridge Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

In 2014-15 Academic year the school was rewarded with Bronze in the Sainsbury's School Games Mark. In 2015-16 the school developed their competition programme and were awarded with a Silver.

The Sports Premium provision is ensuring we are giving our children outstanding PE and sporting opportunities within and beyond the school community. The majority of our Primary School Sport's Funding enables us to employ Physical Education specialists. This has provided outstanding P.E. delivery to all phases of the school; further enhanced our extra-curriculum provision; provided staff with excellent CPD opportunities and contributed to all pupil's health and well-being. Furthermore, it has allowed us to be entering into more competitive sports competitions.
