Research shows that families who enjoy reading together have more opportunities for discussion, developing empathy and attachment. Reading to your infant is one of the greatest gifts parents can give. By starting the journey of building a lifelong love of reading for pleasure, parents are giving their child the opportunity to be the best they can be: children who read for pleasure do better in a wide range of subjects at school and it also positively impacts children's wellbeing.

Research also shows that children who read have a greater range of vocabulary and are more successful in later life. Let's give our children the greatest start!

ACCESSIBLE READING

We have year group Reading Sheds. These are accessible everyday, both morning and afternoon. Children are welcomed and encouraged to use as they please, taking books home and returning once enjoyed. There is a beautiful selection available and in great condition.

READING AMBASSADORS


Reading ambassadors are keen to promote a love of reading across school and are excited to start reading with EYFS and Key Stage 1 on a Thursday lunch time.

THE IMPORTANCE OF READING AT HOME



Student A:

Reads 20 minutes per day = 3,600 minutes per school year





Student B:

Reads 5 minutes per day = 900 minutes per school year



282,000 words per year



Student C:

Reads 1 minute per day = 180 minutes per school year



8,000 words per year



If they start reading 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th-grade student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, student B 12 school days and student C only 3 school days.

READING RAFFLE

Reading raffle tickets are awarded for a child reading at home at least 4 times per week. Children are also rewarded in class by recognition, reward points and moving up class reward systems.

Every reading raffle ticket earned is added to a pot which is drawn once every 4 weeks in a key stage assembly. There is one winner for every class and winners are able to select a brand new book to take home to keep.
